<b>positive</b>	[ˈpɒzɪtɪv]
<b>negative</b>	[ˈnegətɪv]
<b>some</b>	[sʌm]
<b>any</b>	[eni]

We use **some** in positive sentences,  
but we use **any** in questions and negative sentences.  
*I have **some** books.*  
*Do you have **any** books? I don't have **any** books.*

<b>Are there any <i>students</i> in the classroom?</b>	Yes, there are <b>some</b> <i>students</i> in the classroom.
<b>Are there any pictures on the walls?</b>	Yes, there are <b>some</b> pictures on the walls.
<b>Do you have any <i>pens</i> in your <i>bag</i>?</b>	Yes, I have <b>some</b> <i>pens</i> in my <i>bag</i> .
<b>Do I ask you any questions?</b>	Yes, you ask us <b>some</b> questions.

**(not) any** [nɒt eni]

<b>Are there any <i>boxes</i> in the classroom?</b>	No, there aren't <b>any</b> <i>boxes</i> in the classroom.
<b>Are there any pictures on the floor?</b>	No, there aren't <b>any</b> pictures on the floor.
<b>Do you have any <i>pencils</i> in your <i>pocket</i>?</b>	No, I don't have <b>any</b> <i>pencils</i> in my <i>pocket</i> .
<b>Do you ask me any questions?</b>	No, I don't ask you <b>any</b> questions.
