 in this building.

 where would you live?

If I could live **anywhere**,
 I'd live in *South Asia*.

If there were nowhere for you to sit,
 what would you do?

If there were **nowhere** for me to sit,
 I'd *bring a chair from the corridor*.

notice [ˈnəʊtɪs]

Do you read the notices on the board
 in the school?

Yes, I read the **notices** on the board
 in the school.

Why?
 Why not?

or: No, I don't read the **notices** on the ...
 Because *there is some useful information*.
 Because *they are boring*.

What are the notices about?

The **notices** are about *lesson times*.

What's the first thing that you notice
 when you meet somebody for the
 first time?

The first thing that I **notice** when I meet
 somebody for the first time is *their eyes*.

Did you notice whether I said *Hello*
 in *Italian* or in English at the
 beginning of the lesson?

Yes, I **noticed** that you said *Hello* in
English at the beginning of the lesson.
or: No, I didn't **notice** whether you ...
