Past simple and past continuous forms

	past simple	past continuous
+	verb + -ed He <b>checked</b> my report.	was   were + verb -ing He was checking my report.
-	did   did not + verb I didn't watch the movie.	was   were not + verb -ing They weren't watching the movie.
?	did + verb?  Did he speak to the boss?	was / were + verb -ing ? Was he speaking to the boss?

Many commonly used verbs are irregular in the past simple:

 $go \rightarrow went$  spend  $\rightarrow spent$  buy  $\rightarrow bought$  catch  $\rightarrow caught$ 

## Past simple and past continuous uses


We use the past simple when we want to:

· talk about a completed action in the past



I looked at a couple of magazines.

· emphasize that an action is completed



I worked for Blick Enterprises in the summer. (= and then I stopped working for them.)

 talk about actions that follow other actions in the past


When I finally **got** here and **went** to the baggage pick-up, my luggage **didn't turn up** on the carousel.

 talk about an activity that took place regularly in the past

I brought my lunch every day last week.

We use the past continuous when we want to:

 talk about an action that was in progress at a certain point in the past, especially when another action interrupts it



I was just catching up on my email when your flight arrived.

· emphasize the duration of the action

I was working for Blick Enterprises all summer. (= it was a long time)

 talk about actions that continued at the same time in the past



I was looking for my boarding pass while I was walking to the gate.

## Used to vs. be / get used to + -ing

It can be easy to confuse used to and be / get used to.

We use <u>used to</u> when we talk about past actions or routines that we no longer follow and permanent situations that are no longer true.

+	used to + verb	She <b>used to travel</b> alone
-	did not use to + verb	He <b>didn't use to</b> travel by boat.
?	diduse to + verb?	Did they use to check all the bags?
