When a customer enters a store, he sees the **display** of the merchandise that is for sate. All the merchandise in the store has a price tag or a label with a **bar code.** If he doesn't find what he is looking for, he can place an **order.** The sales clerk at the counter uses the bar code to input the price of the product into the cash **register.** The customer pays for the purchases with cash or a credit card and **coupons** or gift certificates. It is important for him to keep his receipts in case there is a problem with the item. If there is, he has to return the **purchase** to the store with the receipt within a certain time period for a **refund.**
