Grammar

1 Present continuous

We can use the present continuous when we talk about an event or action that we have planned for the future.

We are launching our new product at the trade show. He's coming home from the convention this Thursday.

2 Present simple

We can use the present simple

* when talking about timetables and programs

I finish my work at 5:00. What time does the meeting start?

* when referring to a future time in a clause beginning with after, as soon as, before, when, until

Should I email them **as soon as I make** the reservation?

When I arrive in Tokyo I will pick up the rental car that I booked.

3 Will

Ī	+	<i>will ('ll)</i> + verb	She'll come to the meeting.
ĺ	-	will not (won't) + verb	We won't come to the meeting.
ĺ	?	<i>will</i> + verb?	Will he come to the meeting?

We use will when we:

* make a decision about the future at the time of speaking

Let's see. It is 7:30 now. I'll take over the post while you have dinner.

Will that take long? No, it won't take more than 15 minutes.

* indicate being prepared or willing to do something

We'll let you know what the options are.

Will you send over some more pamphlets if we need them?

4 Going to

+	am / is / are going to + verb	He's going to come to the conference.
1	am / is / are not going to + verb	We're not going to come to the conference.
?	am / is / are going to + verb?	Are you going to come to the conference?

We use *going to* when we:

* intend to do something in the future based on a decision made before now

I'll have to plan what I'm going to pack.

Is Julia **going to be** in charge of product presentations at the show?

* can see that something will happen in the very near future

Those flyers **are going to fall** off the counter.

5 Comparing will and going to

Intentions

- **A: I'm going to look** at some of the other frames during my time off. (A decision made before speaking.)
- B: That sounds like a good plan. We'll join you if you don't mind. (A decision made at the moment of speaking.)
