

## Adverbs: Using still, yet, and already

### Still

We use **still** to show that something continues up to a time in the past present or future.

- **It goes in front of the main verb:**

The children still enjoyed playing games.

They are still living next door.

We will still be on holiday.

- **Or after the present simple or the past simple of be:**

Her grandfather **is still** alive.

They were still unhappy.

### Already

We use **already** to show that something has happened sooner than it was expected to happen.

- **Like still, it comes before the main verb:**

The car is okay. I've **already fixed** it.

It was early but they were **already sleeping**.

- **Or after the present simple or past simple of the verb be:**

It was early but we **were already** tired.

We **are already** late.
