

Degree of Comparison:

1. Positive Form

→ These are the simple adjectives that simply describe the noun without comparing it to another - **big, sweet, clean, etc.**

Example:

She has a **big** black dog.

He is a **sweet** boy.

The plate is **clean**.

2. Comparative Form -

→ These are used when we are comparing two nouns and need to show which noun possesses the adjective or character in a greater or lesser amount, when compared with the other. - **bigger, sweeter, cleaner, etc**

Example:

I have a big dog but hers is **bigger**,

He is **sweeter** than the other boys.

My plate is **cleaner** than his plate.

3. Superlative Form

→ This form is used when three or more nouns are being compared and we need to show that one or more of the nouns possess the adjective or characteristic to the highest amount possible. We usually add 'the' before the superlative form. - **biggest, sweetest, cleanest, etc.**
