HAD TO the past of HAVE TO

Must doesn't have the Past Tense or the Future Tense. For the past and future we use have to instead of must.

For example:

I must write a letter.

I had to buy new shoes last week.

I will have to tidy my room.

MUST	HAD TO	WILL HAVE TO
PRESENT	PAST	FUTURE

I MUST write a letter now.

I HAD TO write a letter yesterday.

I WILL HAVE TO write a letter tomorrow.

I had to buy new shoes last week.

GIVE ME AN EXAMPLE OF A SENTENCE WITH WILL HAVE TO IN IT, PLEASE.

I will have to tidy my room.

MUST YOU TIDY YOUR ROOM?

Yes, I must tidy my room.

DID YOU HAVE TO TIDY YOUR ROOM LAST MONTH?

Yes, I had to tidy my room last month.

or No, I didn't have to tidy my room last month.

DID YOU HAVE TO DO YOUR HOMEWORK LAST WEEK?

Yes, I had to do my homework last week.

WILL YOU HAVE TO DO YOUR HOMEWORK NEXT WEEK?

Yes, I'll have to do my homework next week.

WILL YOU HAVE TO EAT ANYTHING TOMORROW?

Yes, I'll have to eat something tomorrow.

WILL WE HAVE TO WEAR WARM CLOTHES NEXT WINTER?

Yes, we'll have to wear warm clothes next winter.
