

Dogs Remember Like Humans

Vocabulary:

break down (phrasal verb)

– (in this case) to destroy something or make it disappear, especially a particular feeling or attitude that somebody has

Example: The group is being perceived as the one trying to break down traditional family values.

wrinkle (noun)

– (in this case) a change in a customary procedure or method

Example: We added a wrinkle to the quality control process in order to reduce the number of faulty products being shipped to our customers.

imitate (verb)

– to copy somebody/something

Example: Children tend to imitate the behavior of adults around them.

fade (verb)

– to disappear gradually

Example: My interest in the conference faded as the event went on.

imply (verb)

– (in this case) to make it seem likely that something is true or exists

Example: The survey implies that the election could have an unexpected outcome.

Article: Dogs Remember Like Humans

Your dog's memory works much more like yours than previously thought, according to a new study.

Writing in the journal *Current Biology*, researchers from the MTA-ELTE Comparative Ethology Research Group in Budapest, Hungary, say that, like people, dogs can “remember and recall events from the past, even when those events didn't hold any particular importance at the time they occurred.”
