

Either / or versus neither / nor

Either/or and neither/nor

1. **Either / or** - used in a sentence in the affirmative sense when referring to a choice between two possibilities

Ex : We can either eat now or after the show - it's up to you.

2. **Neither / nor** - used in a sentence in the negative sense when you want to say that two or more things

are not true

Ex : Neither my mother nor my father went to university.

Singular or plural

When using either/or and neither/nor, note the following rules:

1. If both elements are singular, then the verb is singular too.
