Do you know what is a scar? Do you have one? A scar is the pale pink, brown, or silvery patch of skin that grows in the place where you once had a, cut, scrape, or sore. A scar is your skin's way of repairing itself from injury.

Look at your skin. You probably have one or two scars already. Most people do. Why? Because a lot of things leave behind scars — from falls to surgeries.

Scars are part of life and they show what you've been through. For some people, scars are special. A kid in your class might have a scar on his chest because he had heart surgery as a baby. Or you might have a scar from chickenpox.
