II. Grammar Review

Topic: Differences in meaning between Count and Non-Count Nouns.

PROBLEM: Some nouns have different count and non-count meanings.

SOLUTION: Pay attention to the meanings of the noun.

EXAMPLES:

Incorrect : Coffee is activating my nerves.

Correct : Five cups of coffee are activating my nerves. (count)
Correct : Coffee improves short-term memory . (non-count)

Explanation: Five cups of coffee is countable because it means five individual

nonliving things. Coffee for activating nerves is a non-count noun like food. Nouns, such as light or hair, change meanings depending

on whether they are count or non-count nouns.

For example:

Non-count : There's not enough light to read from.

Count : The street lights go on at dusk.
