

Using “used to” for past habits

FORM : used to + VERB

Example: I **used to go** to the beach every day.

“Used to” for past habits

We use “used to” to talk about past events which we no longer do. We only use it to talk about the past; there is no similar expression for the present.

I studied French, but I don’t anymore. → I used to study French.

Note: after “**used to**” we always use the **infinitive**. Never use a continuous or past tense verb:

I used to smoke.

I used to ~~smoking~~.

I used to ~~smoked~~.

Asking questions using 'use to'

We usually use 'did' when we ask about past habits.

The typical question form is:

Did you use to watch Mickey Mouse?

Did you use to like school?

Note: “**Use to**” is used in the question form not 'used to'.
